2010 Water Week Poster Contest: Information & Entry Requirements

Background Information:

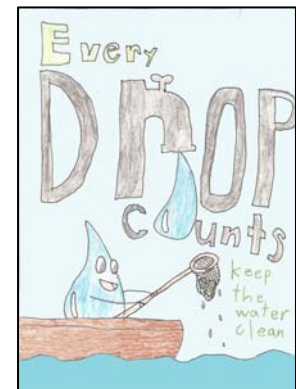
The Minnesota Rural Water Association (MRWA) Poster Contest is held annually for 4th grade students to showcase their artwork through a poster drawing of 1) groundwater or drinking water protection activities, OR 2) water conservation practices that can be done at home. Ideas and thoughts for the student posters can easily be generated from parts or portions of the 4 lesson plans provided by MRWA as part of the packet of information supplied to the 4th grade teachers by City or Utility staff also working with your local community water department or city staff. Local winning poster is selected and submitted to the MRWA before February 1st, 2010. How you select your local winner is up to you!

The top three poster entries submitted will be on display and the winning poster will be selected by the association the 1st week of March at the annual MRWA Technical Conference. The winning poster and student will be recognized by MRWA in your community during Water Week Awareness activities the first week of May. The winning poster will also appear on the summer issue of the MRWA Magazine cover called "Today" that is circulated to all our members.

It is quite a big deal!!!!

Poster Entry Requirements:

All posters **MUST** be drawn on 8 ½" x 11" paper **VERTICALLY** on the page (not in landscape position) to qualify so the poster can be used on the cover of our magazine. All posters submitted must be drawn by a 4th grade student in a school in the MRWA member community or service area. Last year's winning poster shown at right.



Deadlines:

The local winning 4th grade student poster must be submitted to the MRWA Office by **February 1st, 2010**. (MN Rural Water Association, 217 12th Ave. SE, Elbow Lake, MN 56531)

Prizes & Awards:

First place prize is a \$100 Savings bond to the student winner. Second and third place winners will also be awarded prizes by MRWA. The winning City or Water System staff person responsible for coordinating the event in their community will be recognized for their efforts!
